
EVICTIONS IN IDAHO STATEWIDE DATA FOR 2022

In 2022, Idaho averaged...

3.0 evictions per day





49.9% of renting households with an eviction filing received a formal eviction.

This is a **5.2%** drop from 2019 and a **2.8%** drop from 2021. The drop in the rate could be a result of organizations increasing eviction prevention services in 2022.

1,289 landlords filed at least one eviction.


142 renting households had two or more eviction filings.

2,167 of Idaho's 186,065 renting households had an eviction filing.

1,082 Idaho renting households received a formal eviction.



Evictions and Filings from 2019-2022



Eviction filings

occur when a landlord initiates an eviction case in court that may or may not result in expulsion of a tenant from a residence.

Eviction filings *increased* by 10.7% from 2021.

Formal evictions

occur when a court judgment results in the expulsion of a tenant from a residence.

Formal evictions
decreased by 2.3% from 2021.

In 2022, Idaho residents still had access to emergency rental assistance funds provided in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Even though eviction moratoria were not in place in 2022, filings and formal evictions remain below pre-pandemic levels. This could be a result of successful distribution of rental assistance funds or increased mediation in high population counties such as Ada and Canyon.
