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Boise State University's TRIO Educational Talent Search

TRIO Educational Talent Search (ETS) is a federally funded program sponsored by the U.S. Department of Education. ETS was originally sponsored by Sargent Shriver and was one of President Johnson's Great Society measures.

The program has been funded nationwide since 1965 and in the Treasure Valley since 1974. Boise State University Educational Talent Search (ETS) has continued to obtain funding and is able to provide expanded services to students.

Boise State University ETS serves 1,543 students grades 8-12. Two-thirds of the participants must be first-generation to college (neither parent graduated from college) and come from limited income families. Students must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident. Participants receive differing levels of service depending upon the grade level.

11th and 12th Grade

ETS students in the 11th and 12th grades are provided with information they will need to enroll in a program of post-secondary education, be it college, university, vo-tech, or trade school.

- Admissions information
- College visitations
- Course requirements
- Pre-college test preparation and registration assistance (ACT, SAT, COMPASS)
- Scholarship information
- Financial aid application processing
- · Career information and tutoring
- Financial literacy

Over 90% of ETS students receive scholarships and/or financial aid

9th and 10th Grade

ETS students in the 9th and 10th grades are provided with additional study skills assistance, career information, and course work selection.

- Career information is disseminated

- Pre-college test prep and registration assistance (PSAT/PLAN)
- Financial literacy

8th Grade

Students enrolled in ETS as 8th graders receive a variety of services concerning:

- Opportunities to attend field trips pertaining to career exploration
